Sun Moon Lake, the biggest fresh lake in Taiwan, emerges from the shadow of 921 and is firmly on track to become an international tourist 33. Last year alone, the scenic site welcomed over two million visitors. The area 34 with a large array of insects and bird species. The insects include varieties of beetles, dragonflies, butterflies, bees, cicadas and fireflies. Birds 35 the place are egrets, herons, kingfishers, hens and partridges. Aquatic life contains shrimp, carp and the locally-renowned president fish.

Once known as “Dehua Village”, this is the main Thao settlement. The tribal performances and cultural exhibitions are offered here, as well as a shopping area full of 36 atmosphere. Acidification of the ocean has been on the rise, thanks to increasing levels of carbon dioxide (CO₂) in the atmosphere. The CO₂ dissolves in the water, which makes the water more acidic. Scientists had thought this acidic growth would cause shells of sea creatures to become fragile. However, the latest study published in the journal *Geology* reveals that marine life may show a wider range of responses to CO₂-affected acidification than previously believed: some may get weaker while others become stronger.

According to the survey, researchers grew 18 different species of marine animals at various levels of CO₂. The finding indicated that 7 species (crabs, lobsters, shrimp, red and green algae, limpets and temperate urchins) built more shell when exposed to increased acidification. 4 types of organisms (oyster, scallops, temperate corals and tube worms) showed a clear shell reduction as acidity rose, with 6 species (hard and soft clams, conchs, periwinkles, whelks and tropical urchins) seeing their shells dissolve. One species (mussels) showed no response.

“The impact of ocean acidification on all life will be **catastrophic**,” warned Ries, an oceanographer. “The only way to stop ocean’s destruction is to limit CO₂ emissions as a matter of importance,” stated the marine scientist.

Kissing a frog may not result in meeting a handsome prince, but it could be miserable.

The U.S. health officials have been investigating the outbreak of Salmonella in 31 states since April, 2009, due to contact with water frogs. Of the 85 cases, 77% of patients are younger than 10 years old. No deaths have been reported. Although reptiles, turtles in particular, were responsible for the previous nationwide Salmonella outbreaks, this is the first known multistate outbreak spread by amphibians. In this case, the amphibians were African dwarf frogs.

The most likely source in this outbreak was contact with water from the frogs' aquariums. African dwarf frogs are small, so they tend to rest at the bottom of aquariums. Nearly 35% of contaminated households cleaned the frog aquariums in the kitchen, "posing a risk for cross contamination with food preparation areas," the health official notes.

"Anyone with a weakened immune system, children younger than 5 years old and the elderly should avoid contact with reptiles and amphibians," states the health official. "Preventive measures include hands thoroughly washed after touching animals or cleaning aquariums." warns the doctor.
