Men and women differ greatly in the way they shop. As descendants of hunter-gatherers, both men and women have the tendency to accumulate things. However, how they go about it has much to do with whether they are male or female. Paco Underhill, author of *Why We Buy*, conducted a decades-long study of shoppers, observing their browsing and purchasing patterns. Among other things, Underhill found out that when it comes to shopping, men hunt, and women gather.

Simply put, men shop using the skills developed to obtain meat in a hunter-gatherer environment. Underhill's research found that while most women read price tags on items before taking them home, only a handful of men do the same as they make purchases. For natural hunters like men, ignoring price tags and going straight for the kill is a measure of their masculinity. Besides, hunters have to be capable of using skills aimed at getting the kill back to the family before it spoils.

Women, on the other hand, generally enjoy shopping. Unless accompanied by their male partners, women would browse much longer, closely examining the items they desire. Gatherers need to be able to assess if a fruit or vegetable is ripe, which may explain why women are more sensitive to smells and textures and variations in reds, pinks, and yellows than men. This also explains why stores place piles of appealing textured clothes at their entrances—they are meant to draw shoppers into the stores, where further temptation awaits.

Nothing would be known of Lobo the wolf were it not for the writings of the man ultimately responsible for his death in 1894.

Ernest Thompson Seton, a skilled hunter, willingly took up the job to kill a pack of wolves that had been taking livestock in the Currumpaw Valley, New Mexico. Seton was tempted by the challenge and the alleged \$1,000 reward for capturing Lobo, the male leader of the wolf group, and he expected the job to last just two weeks.

However, Seton had not foreseen the cunning and determination of Lobo, who kept away from poisoned baits and sprung hundreds of traps without being caught. It was months before Seton finally succeeded in catching Lobo by luring him with the dead body of his mate, Blanca.

Touched by Lobo's bravery and loyalty to his mate, however, Seton couldn't bring himself to finish off this magnificent creature. Therefore, he captured Lobo alive, with a view to taming this wolf king. Nevertheless, Lobo died that same night—from a broken heart, wrote Seton, who never killed another wolf after Lobo's death.

Seton decided to devote the rest of his life to convincing his nation, which had been built on conquering wilderness, to save what was left. "Lobo the King of Currumpaw," in which Seton cast himself as the wicked guy, became the best-known tale in his 1898 book *Wild Animals I Have Known*. It struck a chord with many Americans, and led to the establishment of new national parks and environmental laws.
